Remembering Joe Yanta

Joe Yanta, one of the founding Board members of the Polish Heritage Center, passed away on December 11, 2024 in San Antonio. He was the last of the eight children of John Andrew Yanta and Mary Magdalen Pollok, natives of Panna Maria who raised their family on their ranch in Runge. His funeral was held January 3, 2025 at St. Matthew's Catholic Church in San Antonio. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife Joyce, and is survived by children Madelon Yanta Leone (husband Charles Leone), Mark Yanta (wife Marisa Davis Yanta), Matthew Yanta (wife Victoria Pomilla Yanta) and Maurie Yanta Bosl (husband Dustin Bosl) and their families.

I had the privilege of knowing Joe for more than 25 years. He will be remembered for his attention to detail in big picture issues. His grasp of business, having been a business owner, his strategic thinking, his pragmatism, his generosity and willingness to step to the plate for support of individual projects was exemplary. Joe was not only a major donor of the Polish Heritage Center, a member of its Heritage Circle, and a founding Board member, he could be counted on to provide delicious kolaches at any event. When he saw the need for Polish cuisine at PHC events, he found Apolonia Catering in Austin and funded the Polish food for a thank you party for major donors.

Joe was a good friend to his older brother Bishop John Yanta and loved to share his reflection of Bishop Yanta's leave of absence from the seminary to become a successful manager of the family farm and ranch. A few days before Joe died, when he was amid his heroic medical battles, we met, and he signed resolutions relating to the Polish Heritage Center Board, and discussed PHC business, his beloved Texas A&M Aggies, politics and family. He was always looking outward and seeing ways to help others. Joe was a major contributor to the St. Mary's Basilica at A&M, helping what he considered to be the most Catholic university in the United States. He also supported the Polish clubs at both A&M and the University of Texas at Austin, and he was instrumental in shepherding the Bishop John W. Yanta Scholarship. His mind remained sharp and his questions were always on point. Joe was humble and faith filled. He leaves a beautiful legacy.
